




Whitehorse's current resident population size is 178,739 and has been growing at an average annual rate of 0.4% over the last five years.





#### Electoral review


- 11 wards named after major parks

Whitehorse is a resilient community where everyone belongs. We are active citizens who value our natural environment, history and diversity.



## What is Planning?

Understanding the community's needs

#### Implementation through the planning controls

- The Planning and Environment Act sets the legal framework for the planning system
- Each municipality in Victoria is covered by a planning scheme that regulates the
  use, development and protection of the land
- Planning schemes set out the planning rules the state and local policies, zones, overlays and provisions about specific land uses that inform planning decisions
- · Council develops the vision for the municipality with input from the community
- These ideas are included in the planning scheme as local policies and the Municipal Planning Strategy (MPS)
- A planning scheme can only be changed by a formal amendment process
- Permit application decisions must be consistent with the planning scheme

## Decision Making in Planning

# Making fair and transparent planning decisions

#### **Local Government**

- Acts as responsible authority for local planning matters
- Assesses permit applications against the planning scheme
- · Refers application for specialist input
- May require public notice and engagement

depending on the nature of the proposal.

- May request amendments to the Planning Scheme
- May delegate a decision to a council officer

#### **Minister for Planning**

- Is responsible for state significant projects in some areas
- Can refer an application for specialist input
- May take responsibility for important decisions by calling-in
- May delegate some decisions to DELWP

#### Other decision makers

- DELWP
- Delegated decision making on behalf of the Minister
- VCAT
- Decides some planning permit applications on review

66Decisions are made at the state and local level

#### Outcome

- · Permit is issued
- · Permit is refused

## Box Hill Metropolitan Activity Centre (MAC)

- Review commenced late 2018 providing updated Structure Plan and Urban Design Framework (UDF)
- May 2020 Council resolved to note the draft Structure Plan and draft UDF for community consultation, and to seek authorisation from the Minister to commence a planning scheme amendment
- Officers are reviewing feedback from DELWP to progress lodgement of the planning scheme amendment
- Any significant changes will be the subject of a report to Council


#### **Gardens for Wildlife**

\$40,000 available 45 applications granted 2020







## **Nunawading Community Hub**

- Completed and open
- User groups can move in per COVID restrictions
- The new home of more than 30 community groups and Council's Meals on Wheels service, delivering more than 1200 meals a week





#### Whitehorse Centre

#### The new centre will include:

- A 600 seat auditorium with larger stage and modern backstage
- a 200 seat studio theatre
- a multipurpose rehearsal and dance studio
- An open double storey carpark
